

GENERAL JOB REQUIREMENTS • A personal faith in Jesus Christ as their Savior and a desire to grow in their own relationship with Him. • A growing relationship with God and a commitment to godly living throughout the year. • A desire to be involved in spreading the good news of the Gospel in word and deed. • We would request that you dress modestly, nothing too short or too tight.

SENIOR CABIN LEADERS • Be willing to work in cooperation with the program chosen by the director. • Be in charge of a cabin group, modeling obedience, safety, and a servant attitude. • Be in charge of cabin devotions and discussions that result from chapel, devotions, and teaching times. Teaching with godly solutions leading ultimately to the salvation of the children under your care. • Be enthusiastic in participating with the kids in activities. • Cooperate with other cabin leaders and staff. •

JUNIOR CABIN LEADERS • Assist the senior cabin leader in all above duties and learn from their leadership. •

SPEAKER - TYPICAL DAY (8:00am staff meeting – 5min devo) (10:15am morning chapel – speak only if prearranged) (7:00pm chapel – 15-20min message) (10:00pm older kid's connection – 15min devo/question time) • 8:00am - 5 minute devotion during the morning staff meeting to uplift and encourage the staff. o Mon. – Fri. (a total of 5) • 7:00pm - 15-20 minute chapel time message for the whole camp after supper. o Mon. – Fri. (a total of 5) o The gospel must be clearly preached. o Speak to the level of our youngest campers, the 7 year-olds. o Instead of alter calls it is better to deal with the campers individually. Such as asking them to respond in such a way that you can later talk with them one on one. • 10:00pm -15 minutes for the older campers (ages 12-14). After cabin devotions in the evening. o Mon. – Wed. & Fri. (a total of 4) o A message that is directed towards them, their age, and the struggles that they face. (show how Jesus is the answer). o This can also become a good time of interaction with the kids. ♣ Be open for them to ask questions. • Use Time Wisely o Spend time with campers and staff as much as possible. Interaction on the yard will build relationships. This in turn will help them respect and listen to you more attentively. o Feel free to join in on the activities. • 10:15am - There is a possibility of speaking also during the morning chapel times. If you would like to use this time please speak to the director before the month of June.

HEAD COOK • Prepare three nutritious meals plus a bedtime snack each day according to the menu. • Help serve the meals. • Assist in the preparation of the grocery list for the next week of camp. • Recommended (not required) to have a Manitoba Health Food Handler Training Certificate. • Unpaid. **KITCHEN HELP** • Assist the head cook in preparation and serving of meals. •

MAINTENANCE • Daily cleaning duties. (ie. washrooms, garbage) • Building up keep. • Electrical and plumbing work. • Help out as needed.

LIFEGUARD • Be willing to work in cooperation with the program chosen by the director. • Lifeguard waterfront activities. • Possess a valid National Lifeguard certificate • Be enthusiastic in participating with the kids in activities. • Cooperate with other cabin leaders and staff. • Strongly Recommended - Staff training: June 28th – July 2 nd
