
STAFF RESPONSIBILITIES / INFORMATION

Steeprock Bay Bible Camp is an interdenominational camp that teaches the Word of God and principles of Christian life so that children in this area may know Jesus – “The Way, the Truth and the Life” John 14:6

The camp is located on the Steeprock River, 10 miles north and 4 miles east of Mafeking, MB.

GENERAL:

- **Staff training; June 28th – 30th (All staff are encouraged to attend.)**
- A desire to be involved in spreading the good news of the Gospel.
- All staff will receive free T-shirt and tuck.
- Those who have submitted all parts of the application process by May 31st will receive a free hoodie.
- All staff desiring to be considered for a bursary (payment) can do so by printing and submitting the [Bursary Application Form](#).
- If you do not want to allow any photos taken of yourself during camp to be used in promotion of the camp please submit a signed paper stating this.
- All camp staff must submit to the standards and authority of the camp.

DRESS CODE:

- We would request that you dress modestly, nothing too short or too tight.
- No spaghetti strap tops.
- No underwear showing.
- No cleavage or mid riff showing.
- Shorts must come to finger tips when arms are at your side.
- No tights/leggings unless under something else.
- No clothes with swearing, skulls, gang symbols, drug or alcohol symbols.
- No bikinis for swimming unless covered.
- * Long pants and hoodies are recommended for keeping bugs off in the evenings.
- * Water shoes are recommended for the rocky swimming area.

CABIN LEADER:

- A personal faith in Jesus Christ as your Saviour and a desire to grow in your own relationship with Him.
- A growing relationship with God and a commitment to godly living throughout the year.
- Be willing to work in cooperation with the program chosen by the director.
- Be responsible for a cabin group, modeling obedience, safety, and a servant attitude.
- Be responsible for cabin devotions and discussions that result from chapel, devotions, and teaching times.
 - Everything should lead others in such a way that they may know Jesus better.
- Be enthusiastic in participating with the kids in activities.
- Cooperate with other cabin leaders and staff.

HEAD COOK:

- Prepare three nutritious meals plus a bedtime snack each day according to the menu.
- Help serve the meals.
- Assist in the preparation of the grocery list for the next week of camp.
- Recommended (not required) to have a Manitoba Health Food Handler Training Certificate.

KITCHEN HELP:

- Assist the head cook in preparation and serving of meals.

LIFEGUARD:

- Lifeguard waterfront activities.
- Possess a valid National Lifeguard certificate.
- Be enthusiastic in participating with the kids in activities.
- Cooperate with all staff and the programs chosen by the director.

MAINTENANCE:

- Daily cleaning duties. (ie. washrooms, garbage)
- Building upkeep.
- Maintain Electrical and plumbing.
- Help out as needed.

SPEAKER:

- A personal faith in Jesus Christ as your Saviour and a desire to grow in your own relationship with Him.
- A growing relationship with God and a commitment to godly living throughout the year.
- Spend time with campers and staff as much as possible. Interaction with the campers will build relationships which in turn will help them respect and listen to you more attentively.
- Feel free to join in on the activities.

Note: The speaker for teen camp will need to contact the director since the following agenda will not be followed.

Times of day with descriptions

- 8:00am; 5 minute devotion
 - Mon. – Fri. (a total of 5)
 - During the morning staff meeting to uplift and encourage the staff.
- 7:00pm; 15-20 minute chapel time
 - Mon. – Fri. (a total of 5)
 - Message for the whole camp after supper.
 - The gospel must be clearly preached.
 - Speak to the level of our youngest campers, the 7 year-olds.
 - Instead of altar calls please deal with the campers individually. Get them to respond in such a way that someone can later talk with them one on one.
- 10:00pm; 15 minute talk time
 - Mon. – Wed. & Fri. (a total of 4)
 - For the older campers (ages 12-14).
 - Right after cabin leaders do devotions in the evening.
 - A message that is directed towards them, their age, and the struggles that they face. (show how Jesus is the answer).
 - This can also become a good time of interaction with the kids.
 - Be open for them to ask questions.
